# Welcome home

Moving into a new home is a big change for a dog. Help them adjust smoothly with these simple tips.



## CHOOSING THE RIGHT TIME

Ideally, bring your dog home on a weekend or during a period when you have time to dedicate to them.

## START WITH A LIMITED SPACE

Restrict access to a few rooms at first, allowing your dog to gradually get used to their new environment without feeling overwhelmed.

## INTRODUCE THE ESSENTIALS

From day one, show your dog where their feeding area, resting space, and designated potty spot are located.

## STAY CALM AND PATIENT

Let your dog explore at their own pace without overstimulating them. Too much excitement or handling right away can cause stress.

### Practical tip

A blanket or toy with the scent of their previous environment can help your dog feel more secure and adjust more quickly.



# Eat well

A proper diet is essential for your dog's growth and health. It's important to follow the feeding chart on the packaging to adjust portions according to their age and weight.

## BATH TIME

Bathe as needed using a shampoo suited to your dog's coat or skin type (curly, white, sensitive skin, etc.). Rinse thoroughly and dry completely to prevent irritation and moisture buildup in skin folds.

To make potty training easier, take your dog outside frequently, especially after waking up, meals, and playtime. Bringing them to the same spot each time helps them understand where to go. Reward them immediately after every success. If an accident happens, ignore it and clean up discreetly rather than punishing them. Patience and consistency are your best allies.

A puppy can usually hold it for one hour more than their age in months. For example, a 2-month-old puppy can wait about 3 hours before going outside. This is an average and applies when the puppy is home alone during the day.

## 4 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE CRATE

- Helps the puppy feel safe and manage their resting space.
- Makes potty training easier by reducing accidents at night.
- Should never be used as punishment. Set it up with a cushion and toys to make it comfortable.
- Introduce it gradually and positively: keep the door open at first and associate the crate with calm, pleasant moments.

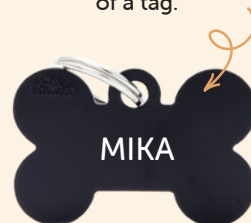

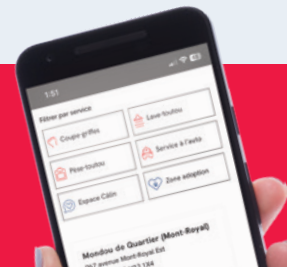

# Car rides

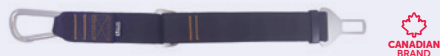
To keep your dog safe, always transport them either in a securely stabilized crate or with a properly fitted car harness.

## Did you know?

An unrestrained dog in a car can be thrown forward in case of sudden braking. For their safety and that of the passengers, use a crate, a harness, or a suitable barrier.



# Socialization

Gradually and gently, it's important to get your puppy used to the situations they will encounter in adulthood.

Use this list as a starting point and adjust it based on their needs.

These experiences should be repeated frequently until they reach six months of age.

Make the most of your walks by getting them used to:

## TO HUMANS

- Adults
- Children, babies, elderly people
- Loud, high-pitched, and deep voices
- Reduced mobility (wheelchair, cane, walker)
- Hats, caps, glasses, beards, mustaches, umbrellas
- Delivery person, mail carrier
- Small groups, large groups

## TO NOISES AND MOVEMENTS

- Bikes, scooters, skateboards, rollerblades, strollers
- Trucks, tractors, cars, trains, buses, motorcycles
- Fireworks, thunderstorms, firecrackers, whistles, music, sirens
- Household appliances (blender, microwave, hairdryer, vacuum, lawn mower)
- Gatherings and celebrations

## TO SENSATIONS

- Rain, snow, and wind
- Handling (pressure, care, examination)
- Clothing (boots, coats)
- Walking with a harness, collar, leash, head halter, muzzle
- Traveling by car, metro, boat
- Different surfaces (gravel, tile, concrete, carpet, plastic)

## TO DIFFERENT PLACES

- Park, dog park, street, school, trail
- Veterinarian, groomer, Mondou
- Countryside, city
- Stairs, elevators

## TO ANIMALS

- Large and small dogs
- Large and small animals

If your puppy is shy, anxious, or overly excited, leave or avoid the situation and consult a canine professional.

# Toxic foods for my dog

Here is a list of toxic foods and products that may be found at home.

Familiarize yourself with this list to protect your companion from these potential dangers.

## TOXIC

- Chocolate
- Grapes and raisins
- Onions, garlic, and chives
- Xylitol (sugar-free gum and candy)
- Avocado
- Macadamia nuts
- Alcohol (beer, spirits, wine)
- Coffee and tea (caffeine)

## NOT RECOMMENDED

- Cooked bones
- Deli meats and fatty meats
- Raw bread and dough
- Raw potatoes
- Raw fish and shellfish
- Fruit pits and seeds
- Green tomatoes and tomato leaves
- Very salty or sugary foods

## TOXIC PLANTS

There are over fifty toxic plants that can be harmful to your new companion.

Here is a short list of the most common toxic plants.

Aloe, azalea, begonia, dieffenbachia, mistletoe, holly, daffodil/narcissus, lily of the valley, tulip, philodendron, poinsettia, rhododendron.

If your pet ingests any of these substances, call or visit a veterinarian as soon as possible.
